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## Medical Marijuana Laws



- ► Medical marijuana laws (MML) legalized the consumption and production of marijuana for patients
- ► First MML in California in 1996. 29 states + DC
- ► MML allow for home cultivation and dispensaries, up to 24 plants per patient
- ightarrow In effect: cannabis consumption and small- to- medium scale production are legal in MML states
  - ▶ Other decriminalisation policies target only possession

# Supply Side



- ► Mexican Drug Trafficking Organizations (DTOs) import most drugs to the US
- ► They protect the trade with violence (homicides, assaults, robberies)
- ► The seven major DTOs sell most types of drugs
- ► Marijuana is\was the nr 1 product for DTOs in terms of market size & revenue
- ▶ It is the only product grown 'at home'
- ► We suspect that the proceeds are used for investment in other drugs

#### Channels




- 1 MMLs provide licit **competition** to the cartels
  - Many small-medium cannabis growers with a better product
  - ► No risk when buying
  - DTO's revenues ↓ and their capacity to invest in violence ↓


#### 2 Spillover channel

▶ As more US states introduce MML, the crime at the border ↓ (along drug routes)



















#### Conclusion



- ▶ Medical Marijuana Laws led to a decrease of 12.5% in crime at the Mexican Border
- ► This decrease is driven by the licit competition and spillovers along drug routes
