In 1988 a little boy Joshua witnessed a violent crackdown of the Burmese military junta on demonstrators, during which more than 3000 people were killed. Since that time he has decided to fight for democracy. Armed with a small video camera and a mobile telephone he decided, together with thirty brave young Burmese from exile television station Democratic Voice of Burma, to document in detail the prodemocracy demonstrations in September 2007 and their brutal dispersal. The dramatic events captured by the reporters' cameras made headlines around the world and offered the only opportunity for the world to see the present situation in Burma. The gripping documentary offers an authentic record of the events when the Burmese took to the streets of Rangoon with a massive support from Buddhist monks. Burma VJ has received a number of awards at international festivals, including the Václav Havel Special Award at the One World Human Rights Film Festival and the main prize at the CPH: DOX festival in Copenhagen and IDFA in Amsterdam.
