Monday, 12 November 2012

Prague Congress Centre, Prague, Czech Republic

1. Opening of the Sitting

The sitting was opened at 9.10 a.m. on Monday, 12 November 2012, with Karl A. Lamers (Germany), President of the NATO Parliamentary Assembly, in the Chair.

The President declared the 58thAnnual Session of the NATO Parliamentary Assembly open.

The Assembly observed a minute of silence to commemorate the life of Charlie Rose, a former President of the Assembly and a co-founder of the Rose-Roth Seminars.

2. Address by Karl A Lamers, President of the NATO Parliamentary Assembly

The President addressed the Assembly.

3. Address by Milan Štěch, President of the Senate of the Czech Republic

MrŠtěch addressed the Assembly.

The President thanked MrŠtěch.

4. Address by MiroslavaNěmcová, the Speaker of the Chamber of Deputies of the Czech Republic

6. Address by Anders Fogh Rasmussen, Secretary General of NATO and Chairman of the North Atlantic Council, followed by a question and answer period

Karl A. Lamers resumed the Chair.

The President thanked **PetrasAustrevicius**(Lithuania), **Jeff Miller** (United States) and **Jadwiga Zakrzewska**(Poland), the outgoing Vice-Presidents, for their contribution to the work of the Assembly.

Jean-Louis Carrère (France) and Beatriz Rodriguez-Salmones (Spain) thanked the President.

"Georgia's active co-operation with NATO through the NATO-Georgia Commission as well as its very significant contribution to NATO-led operations"

Paragraph 3, as amended, was agreed to.

Lucio Malan (Italy) moved Amendment No. 3, as follows:

After the word "Belarus", insert the word

"Georgia"

Amendment No. 3 was agreed to.

Paragraph 4, as amended, was agreed to.

Lucio Malan (Italy) moved Amendment No. 4, as follows:

Delete the word "three"

Amendment No. 4 was agreed to.

Lucio Malan (Italy) moved Amendment No. 5, as follows:

At the end of paragraph 5, add the following words:

"in Belarus, the Russian Federation and Ukraine"

Amendment No. 5 was agreed to.

Paragraph 5, as amended, was agreed to.

Paragraphs 6 to 9 were agreed to.

Victor A. Ozerov (Russian Federation) moved Amendment No. 8, as follows:

"Delete paragraph 10"

SenMalan replied.

Amendment No. 8 was rejected.

Paragraph 10 was agreed to.

Sen Malan (Italy) moved Amendment No. 6, as follows:

Before the word "government" insert the words

"parliament and"

Amendment No. 6 was agreed to.

Paragraph 11, as amended, was agreed to.

Erna Solberg (Norway) moved Amendment No. 10, as follows:

After paragraph 11 insert the following new paragraph

EXPRESSES CONCERNover the reported pressure on local self-government institutions and particularly the Georgian Public Broadcaster and **CALLS UPON**the new Government of Georgia to refrain from politically motivated arrests;

SenMalan replied.

Amendment No. 10 was agreed to.

Sen Malan (Italy) moved Amendment No. 7, as follows:

After the word "Belarus" insert the word

"Georgia"

Amendment No. 7 was agreed to.

Victor A. Ozerov (Russian Federation) moved Amendment No. 9, as follows:

Delete sub-paragraph 12. f

Sen Malan replied.

Amendment No. 9 was rejected.

Joseph A. Day (Canada) spoke.

SenMalan replied.

Paragraph 12, as amended, was agreed to.

The draft Resolution [182 CDS 12 E rev. 1], as amended, was agreed to.

The President resumed the Chair.
